FORESTRY & AGGREGATES:

Simpchw Resources has 2 contractors actively logging at Tahweel. The Fuel Management Project has been completed and submitted, SRLLP will be looking to establish a 4 to 6-man crew for this project.

OTHER NEWS:

Simpchw Resources attended the Simpchw First Nation Career and Job fair on October 22, 2018.

SRLLP board of directors and SRLLP staff attended the Governance Training on October 18 & 19th at the Barriere Lions Hall.

SRLLP board of directors has Strategic Planning planned in November.

PIPELINE MAINTENANCE

We currently have four crews out doing work among the valley for the Pipeline Maintenance contract. They have been installing valves, doing routine pipeline integrity, and brushing for the Natural Hazards work for the month of October. September 1 to October 24 - Pipeline Maintenance has put in 4942-man hours.

SECURITY

We currently have 22 Basic Security employees that have been stationed across the valley. September 1 to October 24, 2018 - Security has put in 4803-man hours.

PROJECT UPDATES

Trans Mountain Canada Inc.: Estsèk' to provide environmental assessment services to an operations and maintenance project at the North Thompson River, south of Blue River, October 2018

TMPL Reactivation: anomaly dig site Environmental Assessments (Anchor Loop and Darfield Reactivation segments)

TMEP: recently completed field data collection for Baseline Water Quality sampling program, also a small amount of assistance with wildlife salvage permit renewal/view

MoTI: Estsèk' is conducting Environmental Overview Assessment services to 3 highway improvement projects including Dunn Lake Rd, Clearwater Intersection and Barriere-to-Exlou.

Trans Alta Bone Creek: We continue to do environmental monitoring at Bone Creek for sediment transport and water quality.

Valemount Lands Transfer Phs 1 ESA: Conducted Office and Field data collection and reporting for 2 land parcels near Valemount (Tete Jaune Cache and Kinbasket) relating to MOTI lands transfer commitments

CN Rail: Final site visit and Summary Reporting at Tete Jaune/Dunster 2016-17 derailment site previously monitored and assessed by Estsèk' (coal release into tributary of Fraser River)

Eagle Rock Construction - Darfield Hwy 5 Improvements; routine environmental monitoring during: stream channel creation and activation, fish isolation and salvage, hydroseeding, construction (grading and packing).

Current Project Updates:

Trans Mountain Expansion Project – The crew has been working alongside Stantec on the Mainline area in Clearwater. Two new sites were recorded and work in proposed sections was completed for 2018.

Canfor PFR – We have completed archaeological office reviews of 63 Canfor blocks and working with SNRD to complete PFRs/CHAs as required.

Tête Jaune Cache Archaeology and Cultural Survey – A crew conducted five days of fieldwork for this project. This project is ongoing and is expected to resume in 2019 with another PFR in additional areas.

MoTI Hwy 16 Robson Inspection Station – An AIA was conducted for the proposed temporary detour adjacent to the Hwy 16 eastbound lane north of Tête Jaune Cache.

Trans Mountain Pipeline – AIA work with Stantec along the existing line is being proposed for late October/ early November (weather permitting).

MoTI and BC Hydro contracts for TCS – Discussions are in the works to get a contract specific to TCS for both MoTI and BC Hydro.

MoTI – Dunn Lake Road Realignment – We are in the process of preparing a cost estimate for an AIA of the proposed Dunn Lake Road Realignment. One fieldwork is approved, it will be conducted under the existing AIA permit in the fall.

MoTI – Hwy 5 Exlou to Barriere Planning Study – Continuing discussions with MoTI and SNRD regarding planning for this project.

IAMC Funding Proposal – A proposal has been submitted to obtain funding to conduct a four-year cultural heritage study at the confluence of the Clearwater and North Thompson Rivers.

Upcoming Projects:

SRE Hydro Transmission Line – The permit for this project has been issued and fieldwork is expected to begin as soon as possible (weather permitting).
