FORESTRY & AGGREGATES:

Two treatment units east of SFN along Dunn lake road have been ribboned out for fire fuel management activities. Activities will remove ladder fuels and dead/excessive underbrush to help reduce fuel loads and fire risk adjacent SFN. A four-person crew will be working on the fuel management project.

Simpchw Resources continues to log Taweel with two logging contractors.

With the completion of the MoTI Darfield project we will be conducting a survey and inspection at the Louis Creek pit.

PIPELINE MAINTENANCE

We currently have four crews out doing work among the valley for the Pipeline Maintenance contract. The crews will be busy in December until Christmas break. October 25 to November 26, 2018 - Pipeline Maintenance has put in 4061-man hours.

SECURITY

We currently have 22 Basic Security employees that have been stationed across the valley. SRLLP has hired 5 new security personnel and welcome them to the team. October 25 to November 26, 2018 - Security has put in 4770-man hours.

OTHER NEWS:

Simpchw Resources will be supporting the TM Environmental Unit within the Simpcw Territory and outside if additional resources are required. We held an introductory meeting with Trans Mountain and GHG on November 20, 2018.

SRLLP Board Meeting is scheduled for December 13, 2018.

Project Updates from Jay Curtis for November

Estsék' Environmental has been working on various Environmental Overview Assessments for highway and road improvement projects located in Clearwater, Barriere and Dunn lake road. These assessments focus on identifying important plants, wildlife use and ecological communities within Project Areas and develop mitigation measures to protect them during construction phases.

Estsék' has also been assisting in various water quality projects including the installation and calibration of remote water turbidity sensors above and below the

TransAlta hydroelectric facility on Bone Creek. This project aims to give

real time data to plant operators, so they can monitor water clarity/flow rates, allowing them to release accumulated sediment above the facility in an environmentally safe and sound way.

Other projects include vegetation surveys and the collection/analysis of baseline water samples at various pipeline right-of-way locations for future Trans Mountain pipeline maintenance projects. This data helps the rehabilitation/monitoring of natural areas that might be disturbed by pipeline maintenance activities.

Current Project Updates:

Trans Mountain Expansion Project – AIA work with Stantec along the existing line, north of Blue River was completed in early November.

MoTI Hwy Barriere - Exlou - A PFR was conducted for the proposed south bound passing lane located between Barrier and Louis Creek and a proposed CVSE pullout located south of Oliver Creek. During the assessment several areas of archaeological potential that will eventually require subsurface testing were identified.

SRE Hydro Transmission Line – An archaeological impact assessment (AIA) was conducted for SRE's proposed transmission line and tenure areas north of Blue River. During the survey areas of archaeological potential were observed. The TCS crew was not able to complete the assessment due to weather conditions. Work will resume in snow free conditions in the new year.

Fieldwork is beginning to wind down as winter weather is fast approaching! Upcoming work will primarily consist of reporting and general administration and management tasks.

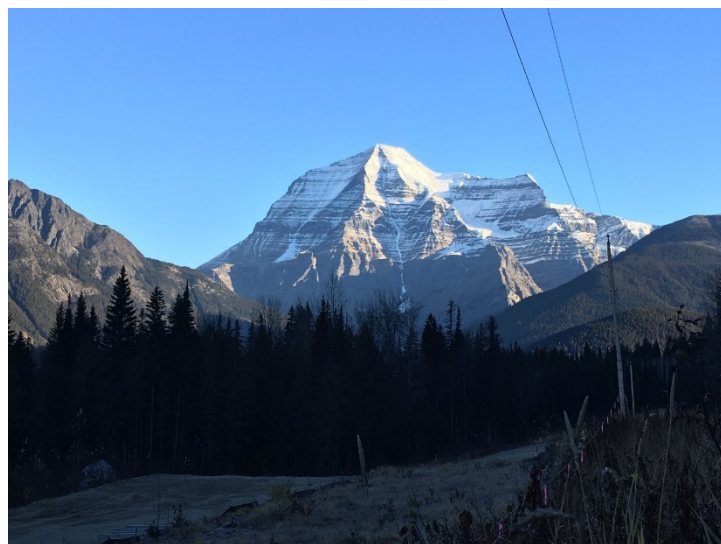
